# Enjoying a Bath – A Part of Japanese Culture

- ◎The waters of Hyotan Hot Springs contain sodium chloride.
- ◎Hyotan Hot Springs are effective for neuralgia, women's diseases, etc.



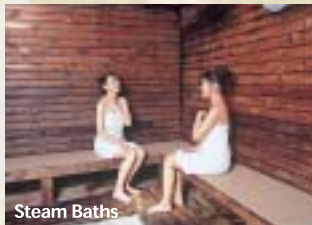
**Outdoor Baths:** Relax under the open sky.



**Hyotan Bath:**  
This bath is shaped like a gourd, or “hyotan”, which is also the name of our facility.



**Foot Bath (No Charge) :**  
This is for soaking your feet. Please bring your own towel.

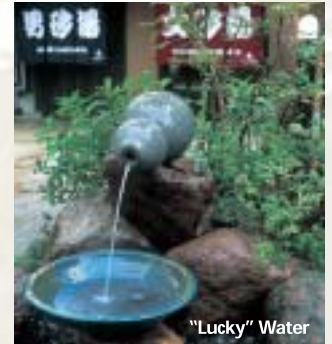


**Steam Baths:**  
These “Japanese Saunas” utilize the steam from hot springs.



**Waterfall Baths:**  
Available for both men and women.

**“Lucky” Water (For Drinking):**  
The water is hot, so please be careful.  
※Not for use by children under six (6) years old.



**Other Baths:** There is a variety of other baths, including: Walking Bath, Cup Bath, Hinoki Bath, Steam Inhalers, etc.



**Sand Bath (men and women mixed):**  
Relax covered in sand heated by the steam of hot springs.  
※35 person limit.



## How to Use the Sand Bath

Rent a robe at the front desk

Change into the robe in the dressing room  
(Please remove all other clothing, including underwear)

Lie down and pile sand on top of yourself  
(The sand bath is entirely self-service.)

When you are finished,  
please brush off as much sand as possible

※Staying in the sand for longer than twenty minutes can result in low temperature burns, so please use caution.



Sand bath admission: ¥300  
(includes a yukata and disposable underpants)

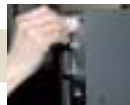
## How to Use the Private Baths

**Time Limit: One Hour**



Check in at the front desk

Insert coin after entering room



Wait for the bath to fill

※After 7 to 8 minutes the water will shut off automatically.

Adjust the water temperature



※The water can be very hot, so please be careful.

Adjust the water temperature using the valve located next to the bath.

Blue→Cold Water

Red→Hot Water(turn slowly)

When you are finished, leave the water in the bath as is.

Shoe Locker



Present the key to your shoe locker along with your admissions ticket at the front desk. You will be given the key to your dressing room locker.

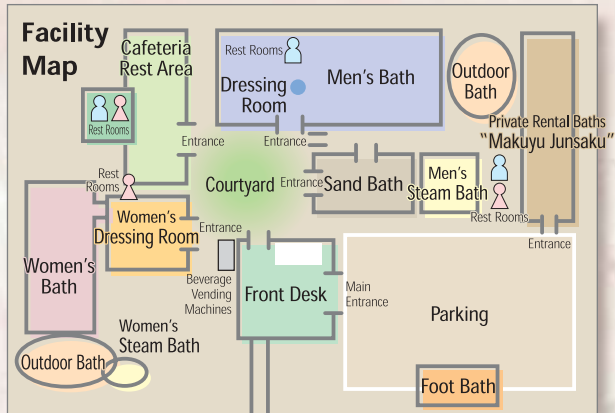


Dressing Room Locker

## Rules for Hot Springs Bathing

### Before Bathing

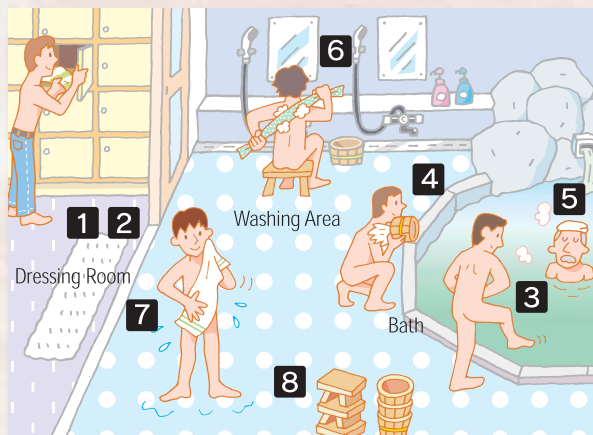
- 1 Disrobe and place all clothing in locker.
- 2 Please use the restroom before bathing.

### Please maintain quite in the bathing areas.

- 3 Please speak softly and enjoy the relaxing atmosphere. Also, please enter and exit the baths quietly and calmly.

### Please keep the baths and bathing areas clean.

- 4 Before entering the bath, please rinse your body with warm water.
- 5 To keep the water clean, please do not put your towel in the bath, or enter the bath with your towel wrapped around you.
- 6 Please use soap only in the washing areas, not in the baths.
- 7 In order to keep the floor of the dressing room dry, please dry yourself before leaving the bathing area.
- 8 Please return stools and buckets to their original locations.



- ◎ After bathing, please rest and drink plenty of water. (The courtyard may be used for resting.)
- ◎ DO NOT pull the plug from the bath at anytime.

### About Kannawa Hot Springs...

It is said that Ippen Shonin, founder of the Jishu sect of Buddhism, opened a health spa in this inferno-like area, sometime in the Kamakura Period. Beppu boasts the second highest volume of hot springs water in the world, and within Beppu, Kannawa is known for its large number of source springs. The view of the steam rising from the many Kannawa hot springs was selected second, behind Mount Fuji, among the top hundred scenes of Japan the Japanese people most want to preserve into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century.

Turn north off of the Trans-Kyushu Highway at the Marushoku Yamanami Store Intersection.
